This year, the VSC will provide an Easter holiday distribution. We plan to conduct two distributions this year, so there will be a fixed amount for each, moving forward.

We are allotting 1,250 vouchers to our veteran community on a first come, first serve basis. The value of each voucher will be \$40.

Veterans, or widows of veterans may stop by the VSC during our regular business hours beginning at 8 a.m. on Monday, April 7 and ending at 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 11 to secure their voucher. Each family is eligible to receive one voucher per veteran in their household. The vouchers will expire on Sunday, April 20, 2025.

Vouchers may be redeemed at the Saybrook and Geneva Giant Eagles. You may use yours to purchase any food items that will assist with your holiday. Prohibited items for purchase are alcohol, tobacco, pet foods, and any non-food item. Remember, you just have that week in April to get your voucher, so block out some time and come by the office!

Veterans MUST provide DD214 showing a character of discharge that is Honorable or Under Honorable Conditions and MUST be current Ashtabula County Residents to receive this voucher. The program is open to widows of veterans as well. If your service has been previously verified, or you have an ID Card from the VSC, you are eligible for this program.

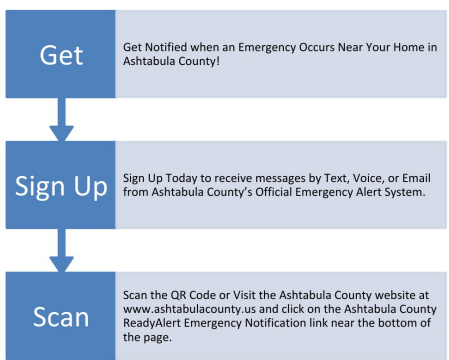

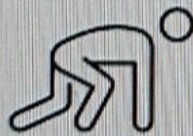

IF YOU HAVE A FELONY OR MISDEMEANOR WARRANT THAT NEEDS TO
BE RECALLED, COME TO COURT AND TRY TO GET IT RESOLVED.

MATCHING FINES PROGRAM

APRIL 28TH THROUGH MAY 5TH, 2025 on cases 2023 or older

A minimum payment of \$100 must be made, and the Court will match any
qualifying payment made at court or online (OVI's, DUI's and restitution are
excluded). The Matching Fines program includes Probation fees as well: A
minimum payment of \$20 towards Probation fees must be made at court or
online and the payment will be matched. Visit our website at
